Thirty baseball fans, Willie Mays, nicknamed "The Say Hey Kid", was the greatest baseball player to ever live. 



ROBERTO CLEMENTE

Born in Puerto Rico on August 18, 1934, Roberto Enrique Clemente Walker grew to be one of baseball's biggest stars on and off the field. The son of a sugarcane worker, Roberto began playing professional baseball just after he finished high school. He first played for the Montreal Royals, a minor league team.

In 1955, Clemente made his major league debut, playing for the Pittsburgh Pirates. Early in his career, he struggled with injuries and communicating in the English language. By 1960, his career really took off. That year, he batted .314 with 16 home runs and 94 RBIs, as well as helping the Pirates win the World Series. As time went on, it was clear that Clemente was one of the players in baseball. During the 1972 season, he became the first Hispanic player to ever reach 3,000 career

Off the field, Clemente was well-respected. He was a quiet gentleman and was very proud of his Puerto Rican heritage. In 1963, he married Vera Zabala and they had three sons. He worked hard to help people in need. Sadly, on December 31, 1972, Clemente died in a crash while on his way to take supplies to earthquake survivors in Nicaragua.

Clemente was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1973 and will always be remembered for his contributions to the sport.

TY COBB

Tyrus Raymond "Ty" Cobb, nicknamed "The Georgia Peach", played major league baseball for the Detroit Tigers from 1905 to 1926. He was known as a wicked player who would do just about anything to win. Many of the stories about him are tall tales, but he always gave 100% effort on the baseball field.

Ty Cobb was born in the rural town of Narrows, Georgia in 1886. His father was a Georgia State Senator who was very strict and didn't approve of his son's baseball playing. He told Ty, "Just don't come home a failure!" So, in 1905 at the age of 19, Ty went to Detroit to play baseball for the Tigers. The following season, he was the starting centerfielder, batting .316 that year. That turned out to be his best season batting average of his career.

For the next 22 years, Ty Cobb became one of the most feared players in the league. He may have been one of the smartest players ever to play the game. During the 1920 season, he became the manager of the Detroit Tigers, and he continued to play for them at the same time. Cobb also holds the record for most steals of home plate of all time at 54!

Ty Cobb finished his career with some of the greatest numbers of all time. He finished with a lifetime batting average of .366. He was also the all-time hit leader with 4,189 hits. That record stood for almost 60 years!

JACKIE ROBINSON

The youngest of 5 siblings, Jack Roosevelt "Jackie" Robinson was raised by a very poor single mother. First, they lived in Georgia, then moved to California. There Jackie Robinson became a star athlete in four sports for UCLA. He played in football, basketball, track, and of course, baseball!

At that time, African-Americans were only allowed to play in baseball leagues with other African-Americans. Major League Baseball was not one of those leagues. The owner of the Brooklyn Dodgers, Branch Rickey, decided it was time to change all that. He searched for several years for a black man who could break into Major League Baseball. In 1945, he found Jackie Robinson and knew he was the man for the job.

It took two years for Jackie Robinson to get called up to the big leagues. It finally happened in 1947. He played in 151 games as a **rookie**. He faced some terrible racism from other teams and fans. He hit .297, hit 12 home runs, and won the Major League MVP award.

Willie Mays was born in the Negro leagues in 1931. His mother was a basketball and track & field star in high school. They raised young Willie to love all sports, but baseball was his favorite. At the age of 16, he started his professional baseball career in the Negro Leagues of the south. Then in 1950, he went to play for the New York Giants. Willie Mays was born in the Negro leagues in 1931. His mother was a basketball and track & field star in high school. They raised young Willie to love all sports, but baseball was his favorite. At the age of 16, he started his professional baseball career in the Negro Leagues of the south. Then in 1950, he went to play for the New York Giants. He became the starting centerfielder for the Giants in May of 1951.

Willie Mays moved to Harlem in New York City and was known to be a very kind man. He was often seen out in the street playing stick-ball with the local children on his days off. Can you imagine a Major-League player playing ball with kids in the street today? When the New York Giants moved to San Francisco in 1958, Mays was also seen at his new home doing the same thing.

On January 23, 1979, Willie Mays was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame.
