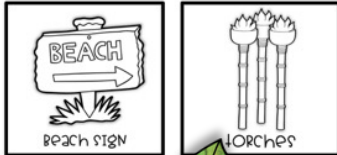


A HAWAIIAN LUAU ESCAPE

THE HAWAIIAN HISTORY

The 50th state of our country has a very interesting history. The islands of Hawaii are located over 2,000 miles west of California and it is the world's largest island chain. It is a U.S. state that is made up of completely islands, however, only 7 of its 132 islands are inhabited. The islands that are inhabited are Hawaii (the Big Island), Maui, Molokai, Lanai, Oahu, K, and Niihau.

The very first people to inhabit the Hawaiian Islands were the Polynesians. Around 5 the Polynesians sailed to the islands by canoe. When they arrived on the land, they farm fished for food. Each settlement that was formed was ruled by a chief and the chief's word the law. The strict rules the inhabitants were required to follow were known kapu.

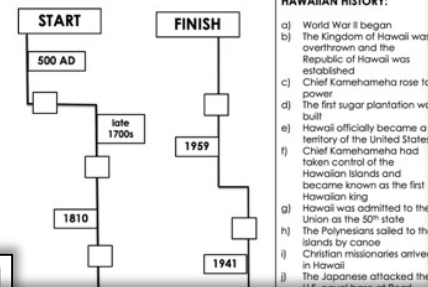
In the late 1700s, one chief, Chief Kamehameha rose to power. He started to take of each one of the islands. By 1810, he had taken control of the Hawaiian Islands and be known as the first Hawaiian king. In 1820, Christian missionaries arrived in Hawaii. They opened schools and taught the Hawaiians how to speak English. Today, Hawaii is the on state with two official languages: English and Hawaiian.

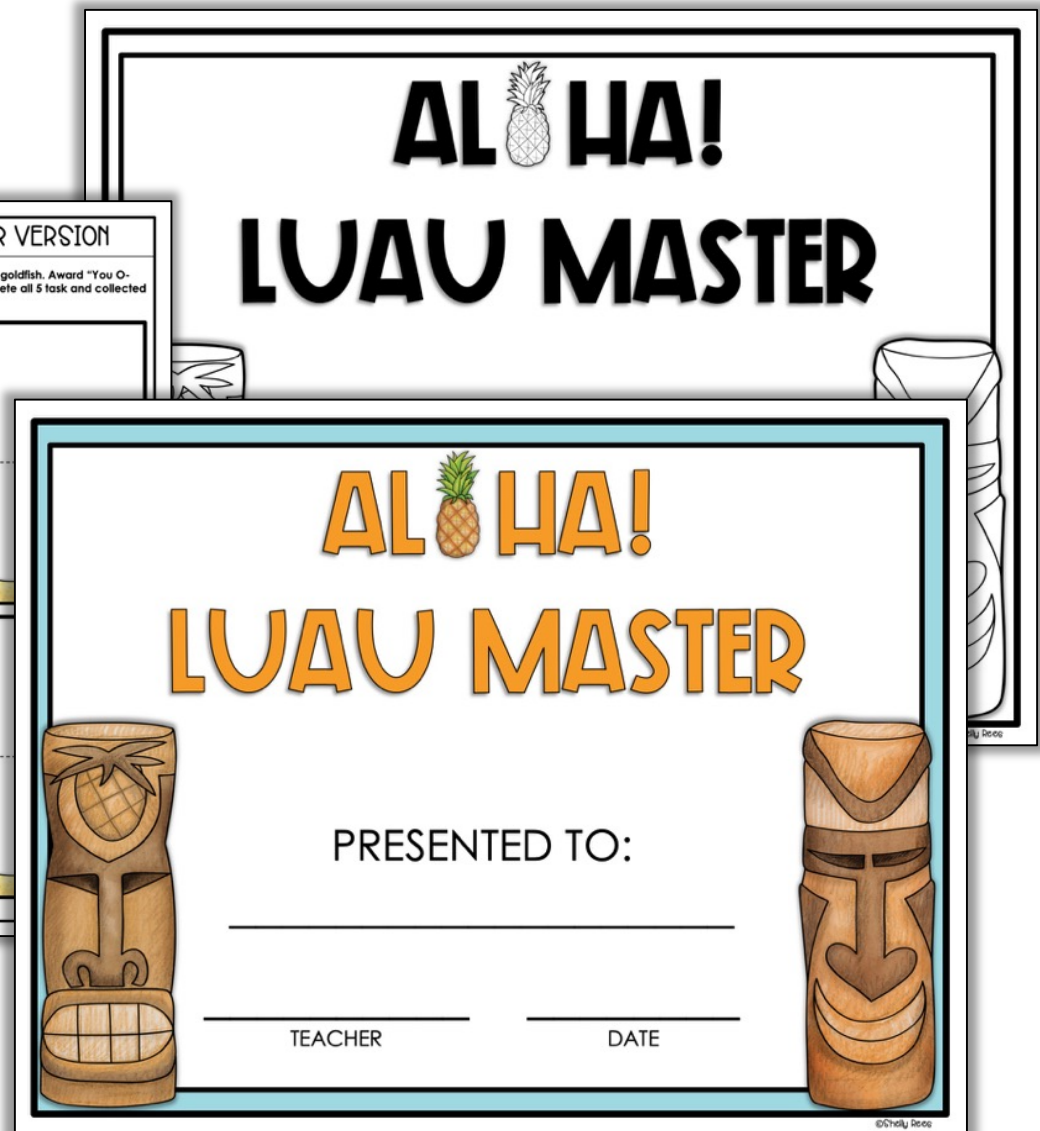
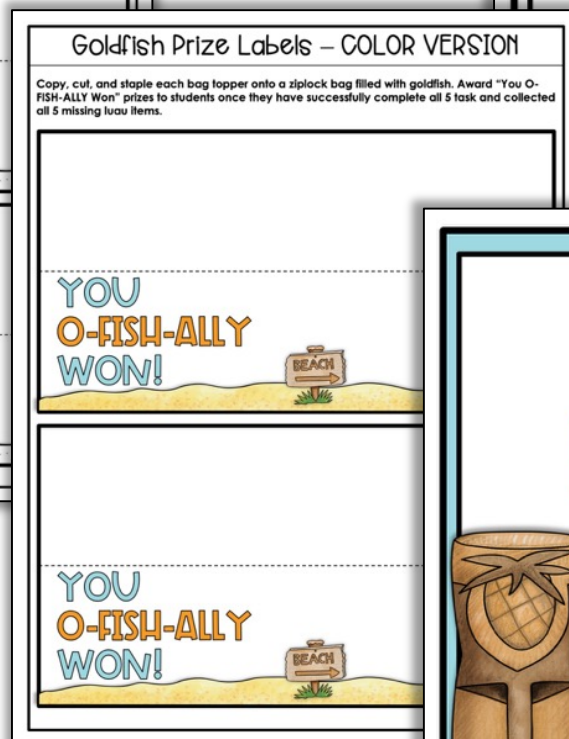
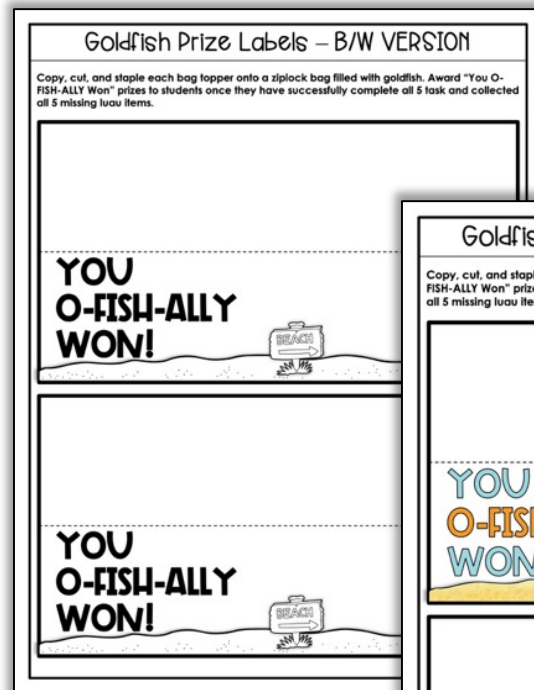
A READING COMPREHENSION ESCAPE ACTIVITY
