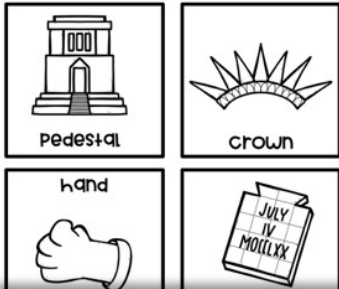


FIND THE STATUE OF LIBERTY

THE STATUE OF LIBERTY: HOW IT CAME TO BE

The Statue of Liberty, also known as "Lady Liberty," is currently located on Liberty Island in New York, New York. It has been there since it arrived in New York City in 1884. The statue came from France as a centennial birthday present to the United States. The French offered the statue as a sign of friendship and to commemorate the United States' independence.

The statue was designed by a French sculptor named Frederic Bartholdi and was built by a civil engineer named Gustave Eiffel. Constructing the statue has not been an easy job. The United States needed to supply the base pedestal that the statue would eventually stand on. The statue needed to be shipped across the Atlantic Ocean in 350 pieces. It had to be rebuilt and arrived to the United States.

The Statue of Liberty, whose full name is "Liberty Enlightening the World" is a colossal statue of a robed lady. She holds a torch in her right hand and a stone tablet in her left. 1776 is inscribed on the tablet to represent the United States' adoption of the Declaration of Independence. She has seven spikes on her crown to represent the seven seas and continents.

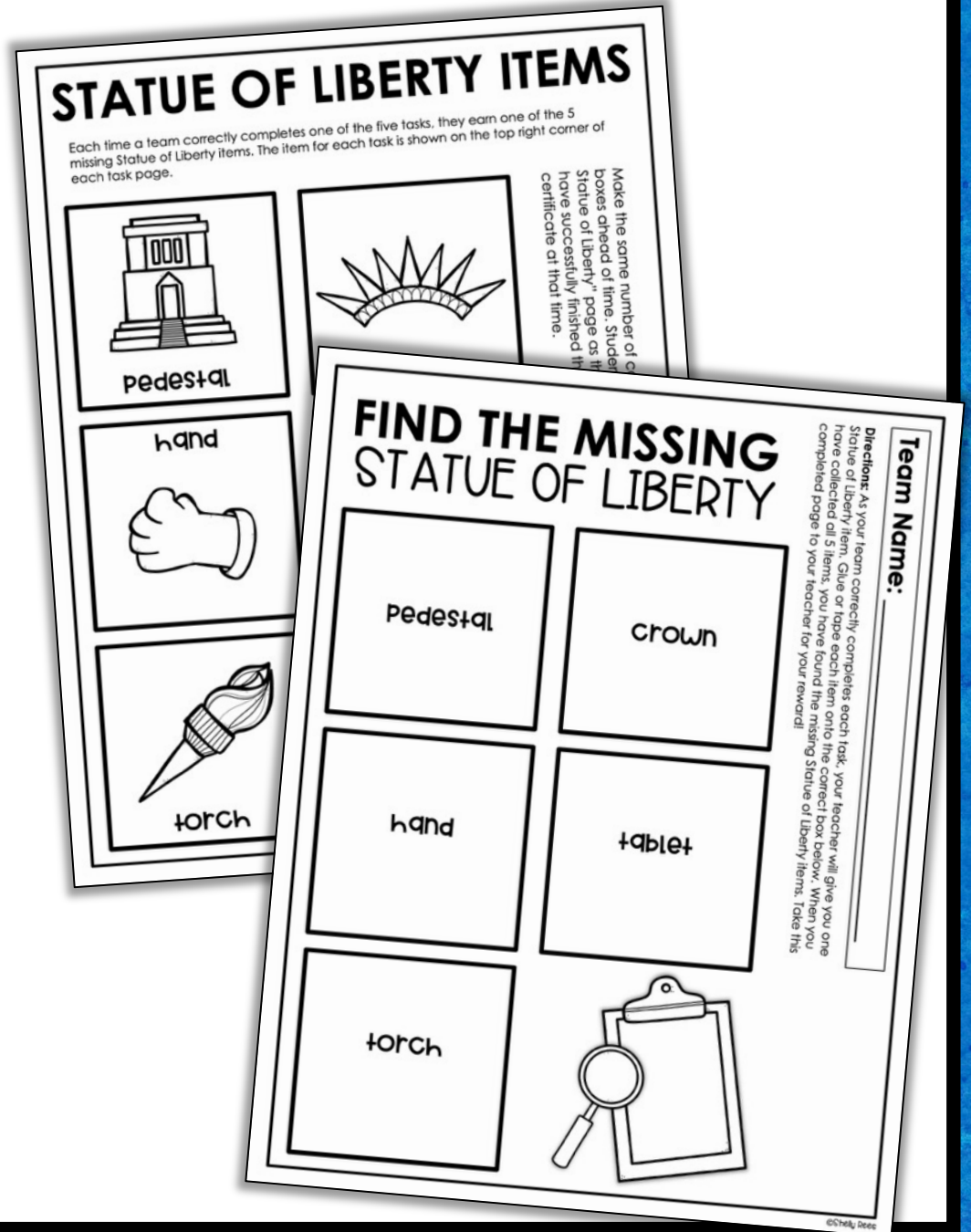

July 4, 1776 is inscribed on the tablet to represent the United States' adoption of the Declaration of Independence. She has seven spikes on her crown to represent the seven seas and continents. There are broken chains around her feet which symbolize the United States breaking free from tyranny, or cruel and unreasonable government. A poem titled "The New Colossus" by Emma Lazarus is on display on the statue's pedestal.


The height of the statue from the base of her feet to the top of her torch is 151 feet. If you include the bronze pedestal that she stands on, she is 305 feet tall.

What many people don't realize is the statue's signature green color, known as patina, is a result of natural weathering of the exterior which is known as oxidation.









The statue served as a beacon of hope for the homeland to find refuge in America. As waves of as a "welcome" sign to a new life that would be fit.
