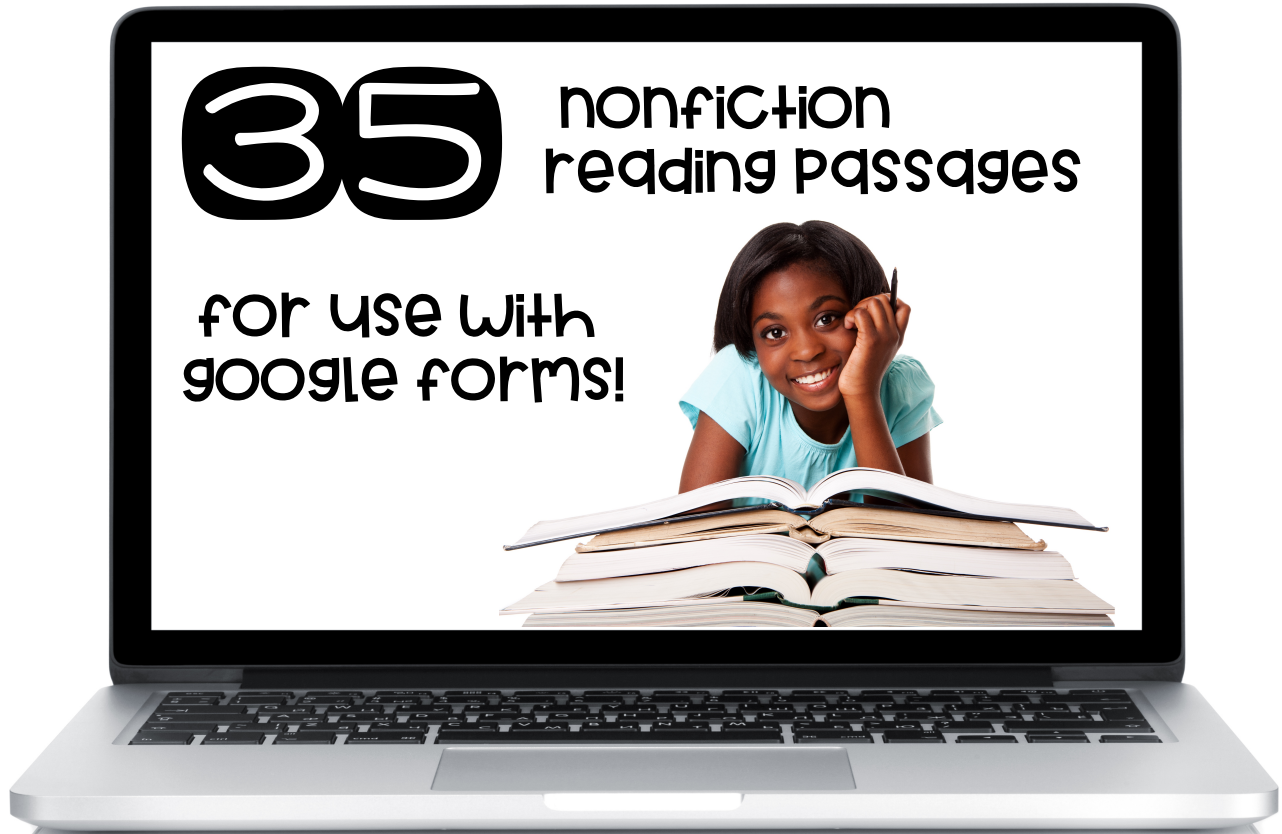

STINGRAYS

One of the oldest ocean creatures is the stingray. Having patrolled the ocean's waters for 100 million years, this graceful ocean creature is also dangerous. Unfortunately, today, many of the world's stingrays are endangered.

Most stingrays are found in warm coastal oceans, but there are a few species of freshwater stingrays. For example, the ocellate river stingray lives in the Amazon River system. Featuring a round, flat body, stingrays often hide in the sand on the bottom of the ocean. However, they are very graceful swimmers and move their bodies either in a wave or flapping motion.


The stingray's mouth is located on the underside of its body. Many species have teeth which they use for crushing their prey. **Carnivorous** creatures, stingrays eat everything from fish to insects, mollusks, clams, and oysters. Because their eyes are on the top of its body, the stingray has to use other senses to find its prey. They find prey using their sense of smell and by sensing the electrical charge of other animals.

There are about 90 species of stingrays in the world, the largest of which can measure up to 6 feet across and weigh up to about 800 pounds. For humans, the most dangerous part of the stingray is its tail. On the end of its

BLUE-RINGED OCTOPUS		ANSWER THE QUESTIONS	
<p>Tiny and colorful, the blue-ringed octopus may even seem cute. However, don't get too close to this ocean creature! Within its small, 10-inch long body, the blue-ringed octopus has enough deadly venom to kill up to 26 people.</p> <p>The blue-ringed octopus lives in shallow ocean waters off the coast of Australia and other islands in the Indo-Pacific. There are plenty of these little octopuses in the waters. It is unlikely you'll see one since they generally stay hidden away in crevices, shells, or amongst rocks. If you do happen to find one, the blue rings will quickly brighten all over its body, warning you to stay away.</p> <p>Crabs, shrimp, and small fish are the prey of the blue-ringed octopus. Typically, the octopus grabs its prey and bites it using its deadly venom. The prey is paralyzed, the octopus chows down on the soft parts, and the skeleton is left.</p> <p>Usually, blue-ringed octopuses only feel threatened by them. A bite from one can result in a quick death that begins with weakness. Then, the venom slowly moves into the body until the victim can no longer breathe. There is no antidote for the venom. However, with the right medical attention, most bite victims can survive. These amazing fish are known for their size, speed, and hunting skills which make them great predators in the ocean.</p> <p>The great barracuda can be found in tropical waters around the world. Reaching lengths of up to a maximum of ten feet, most are closer to about five feet in length. It's not unusual for the fish to weigh 100 pounds. <p>THE STONEFISH</p> <p>Looking down, a swimmer notices a lumpy piece of coral sitting on the ocean floor. However, it's not coral. It's a camouflaged venomous fish. Noticing the swimmer, the fish erects its 13 sharp dorsal spines, ready to release a lethal venom should the swimmer come any closer. Luckily, the swimmer moves on to another area, not realizing they've come very close to meeting a stonefish.</p> <p>The stonefish is the world's most venomous fish. Its sting is not usually deadly, but it can cause extreme pain and other problems. Victims who've been stung by the fish should seek medical attention as soon as possible.</p> <p>Stonefish are found in the coastal waters of Northern Australia and other areas of the Indo-Pacific Ocean, mostly where reefs are present. They are usually brown in color with markings that make them look just like rocks or coral. Some of the fish may feature yellow, red, or orange patches. Typically, the fish spend most of their time hiding on the ocean floor. When prey comes by, the fish darts forward to capture their meal of fish and small crabs.</p> <p>Surprisingly, this venomous fish is also used by humans. They include sharks and stingrays. In fact, some people have found stonefish bones in the stomachs of sharks. Moray eels have also been known to eat stonefish.</p> <p>Stonefish are impressive predators and excellent hiders.
